Your Approval is based on the approval issued to your organization by the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), and is limited to the privileges of your EASA approval and the conditions detailed in your Bermuda Approval.

This approval requires your organization to assess the suitability of components; goods and services provided to you from non-Bermuda Department of Civil Aviation approved suppliers for their acceptability prior to the issue of a Certificate of Release to Service by your organization for an aircraft on the Bermuda register. Such components, goods and services should only come from appropriately approved European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), Joint Aviation Authority (JAA), Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), or Transport Canada (TC) sources.

The approval also permits your Bermuda Approved Signatories to make recommendations to the Bermuda DCA, concerning the issue or reissue of Bermuda Certificates of Airworthiness in the Private or Transport Category, the issue of Certificates of Airworthiness for export and the issue of Permits to fly.
